

Jacob and Esau (Genesis 25:24–26)

104. The Bible compares the righteous to what?

Sheep (Psalm 95:7; 100:3)

105. The Bible compares the wicked to what?

Swine (pigs) (Matthew 7:6; II Peter 2:20–22)

106. What blessing was promised to Jacob before birth?

The promise that God made to Abraham (Genesis 25:22–23)

107. What blessing was Jacob hoping to receive when he deceived his father?

The promise that God made to Abraham (Genesis 12:1–3; 25:22–23; 27:6–19; 28:1–4; 12–15)

Because the Lord was with him (Genesis 39:2, 21)

116. Why was Joseph sent to prison?

He fled from Mrs. Potiphar when she wanted him to do what was wrong. (Genesis 39:10–12, 19–20)

117. How did Joseph respond when he was unfairly placed with both Potiphar and the keeper of the prison?

He became their servant and diligently accomplished all that they asked. (Genesis 39:4; 22–23)

118. What should be my attitude towards work?

119. Until when was Joseph kept in the dungeon?

Until the word of the Lord had purified him (Psalm 105:17–19)

Ephraim (Genesis 41:52)

125. Who did Joseph keep in prison and why?

Simeon—as the oldest brother present when Joseph was sold as a slave, he was responsible for that act. (Genesis 37:19–22, 29; 42:22, 24)

126. What did Joseph's brothers do when the silver cup was found in Benjamin's sack?

They tore their clothes. (Genesis 44:13, NKJV)

127. What did Joseph find in his brothers?

That they had grown in God and had true love for one another (Genesis 42–45)

128. How did Judah respond when Benjamin was going to be taken as a slave?

He pleaded to be allowed to stay in Benjamin's place. (Genesis 44:33–34)

129. What does Moses mean?

Rescued from the waters (Exodus 2:10)

130. What was the name of Moses' sister?

Miriam (Exodus 15:20)

131. What is Satan's goal?

To keep me in slavery and in hard bondage to sin (Exodus 1:14; 5:8–9; Hebrews 2:14–15)

132. What does Egypt represent?

The world or my life in the world before coming to know Jesus as my Savior

(Exodus 12:13; Titus 3:3-7)

133. Who does Pharaoh represent?

Satan (Ezekiel 31:2–18)

To have a change of attitude and direction To turn away from sin and turn toward God (Ezekiel 14:6; 18:30; Acts 3:19; Revelation 2:5)

147. What leads me to repentance?

God's goodness (Romans 2:4)

148. What is essential for survival in the desert?

Water (Isaiah 44:3)

149. The children of Israel are a figure of what?

The church of God (I Corinthians 10:1–11)

150. What does the journey of the children of Israel represent?

Our journey with the Lord (I Corinthians 10:1–11)

151. God gives the inheritance to what kind of people?

The humble (Deuteronomy 8:16; Zephaniah 3:12–17)

152. How did God use the pillar of cloud?

To lead the way by day (Exodus 13:21–22)

153. How did God use the pillar of fire?

To give light and to lead the way by night (Exodus 13:21–22)

By praising Him and recognizing His miracle-working power (Exodus 14:13–14; 15:2–18; Psalm 46:10; Isaiah 40:31)

157. QUOTATION QUESTION. How did the children of Israel pass through the Red Sea?

By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry land. (Hebrews 11:29; Exodus 14:15–16)

158. What happened to Pharaoh's army at the Red Sea?

They were drowned and not one of them remained. (Exodus 14:28; Hebrews 11:29)

159. How many trials did God send to the children of Israel?

Ten (Exodus 14–17, 24, 32; Numbers 10, 11, 13, 14:22)

160. How can I tempt God?

By doubting His presence (reality), love, and intervention in my life (Exodus 17:1–7; Psalm 78:40–41; 106:13–14)

161. How many times did the children of Israel tempt God?

Ten (Numbers 14:22)

162. How did the children of Israel respond at Marah?

They murmured against Moses. (Exodus 15:24)

163. How can I please God in bitter experiences?

By taking up my cross (denying myself) and following Him (Exodus 15:22–27; Proverbs 27:7; Mark 8:34–35)

164. What does Marah mean?

Bitterness (Exodus 15:23)

165. What happened in the wilderness of Sin?

God tried the hearts of the children of Israel with a lack of provision. (Exodus 16:1–3)

166. How did the children of Israel respond in the wilderness of Sin?

They murmured against Moses and Aaron.

They wished to have died in Egypt.

(Exodus 16:1-3)

167. In times of a lack of provision, what opportunity do I have?

To know the Lord as my Provider (Exodus 14–16; Philippians 4:6)

168. What happened to test the children of Israel's obedience?

God gave instructions on how and when to gather manna. (Exodus 16:4, 20; Deuteronomy 9:7, 24)

169. How did the children of Israel respond in their trial of obedience?

They were disobedient and rebellious to God's command. (Exodus 16:4, 20; Deuteronomy 9:7, 24)

170. QUOTATION QUESTION. Where do the rebellious live?

The rebellious dwell in a dry land. (Psalm 68:6)

171. How does God want to take away my rebellion?

Through different trials He sends me (desert experiences) (Exodus 16:4, 20: Psalm 68:6: Jeremiah 5:23–25: Hebrews 5:8)

172. QUOTATION QUESTION. How can a child be delivered from foolishness?

Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child; but the rod of correction shall drive it far from him.

(Proverbs 22:15)

173. God wants me to obey and submit to whom?

My parents in the Lord

My pastor

(Ephesians 6:1; Colossians 3:20; Hebrews 13:17)

174. What happened at Rephidim?

The children of Israel found themselves in a dry place without water. (Exodus 17:1–7)

175. How did the children of Israel respond at Rephidim?

They murmured against Moses and wished they had died in Egypt. (Exodus 17:1–7)

176. How did the children of Israel tempt God at Rephidim?

They asked: Is the LORD among us, or not? (Exodus 17:7)

177. In the middle of the desert, what did the children of Israel never do?

They never lifted their voices to thank and praise the Lord for past or present miracles of deliverance. (Exodus, Numbers, Deuteronomy)

178. QUOTATION QUESTION. According to Proverbs, why is it important to seek the Lord?

They that seek the Lord understand all things. (Proverbs 28:5b)

179. What was the children of Israel's first battle?

The battle against Amalek (Exodus 17:8–16; Genesis 36:12; John 3:6)

180. What does Amalek represent?

The carnal man (the flesh, the old nature) that despises God's way and exchanges it for things of the world (Exodus 17:8–16; Genesis 36:12; John 3:6)

181. What is the first battle God wants me to fight?

The battle against the carnal man (the flesh, the old nature) in my own life (Exodus 17:8–16; Genesis 36:12; John 3:6; Romans 8:13)

182. What happened at Mount Horeb?

For 40 days, Moses was in the mount with God. For 40 days, the children of Israel didn't hear anything from God (there was silence). (Exodus 24:1–2, 12–18; 32:1)

183. How did the children of Israel respond at Mount Horeb?

They turned back to Egypt in their hearts. (Exodus 24:1–2, 12–18; 32:1; Acts 7:39–40)

184. What does Horeb mean?

Desolate (Exodus 33:6; Deuteronomy 1:6; 9:8)

185. Mount Horeb is also called what?

Mount Sinai (Exodus 19:11; 32–33:6)

186. How did God talk with Moses?

Face to face, as a man speaks to his friend (Exodus 33:11)

187. What is the baptism in the Holy Spirit?

It is a promise and a gift from God the Father. (Luke 24:49; Acts 2:38)

188. Where does God want to write His laws?

In my mind and heart (Jeremiah 31:33; II Corinthians 3:3; Hebrews 8:10; 10:16)

189. How did the children of Israel respond to God's voice?

They went back, and stood afar off.
They begged that His word should not be spoken to them anymore.
(Exodus 20:18; Hebrews 12:19, NKJV)

190. How did Moses respond to God's voice?

With fear and trembling he went closer to God—longing for *more* of God's presence.

(Exodus 20:21; Hebrews 12:21-29)

191. What were the children of Israel doing when God was giving Moses the pattern for the tabernacle?

They were making a golden calf and worshipping it. (Exodus 19:22–32:35)

192. The tabernacle is also called what?

The sanctuary (Exodus 15:17)

193. Who could enter the outer court?

All the children of Israel (Leviticus 7:28–30; 9:1–24; Numbers 28–29)

194. Who could enter the holy place?

Only the priests (Numbers 3:5–10; Hebrews 9:6)

195. What does Jesus want to make me?

A king and priest (Revelation 1:6; 5:10)

196. Who could enter the Holy of Holies?

Only the high priest (Leviticus 16; Hebrews 9:7)

197. Where did Moses get the material to build the tabernacle?

From the people who offered willingly—much more than enough (Exodus 25:1–8; 35:4–29; 36:3–7)

198. Who is the door?

Jesus says, *I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved.* (John 10:9)

199. QUOTATION QUESTION. Is Jesus the only way to the Father?

I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. (John 14:6)

200. QUOTATION QUESTION. According to Psalms, how can I cleanse my way?

How can a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed according to Your word.
(Psalm 119:9, NKJV)

201. What does "offering" mean?

To draw near (Leviticus 1:2)

202. How can I draw near to God?

With sacrifices and offerings (Exodus 23:15; Leviticus 1:2–3; Deuteronomy 16:16; Malachi 1:6–14)

203. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why should I present myself as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable unto God?

For of him, and through him, and to him, are all things: to whom be glory for ever. (Romans 11:36; 12:1)

204. What keeps the light of the candlestick burning?

Olive oil (Leviticus 24:2)

205. What does oil represent in the Bible?

The Holy Spirit (Psalm 89:20; Matthew 25:1–13)

206. What kind of light does Jesus want me to be?

The light of the world (Matthew 5:14)

207. What does incense represent in the Bible?

Prayer and intercession (Psalm 141:2)

208. Who intercedes for me?

Jesus (Romans 8:34; Hebrews 7:25) The Holy Spirit (Romans 8:26–27) My leaders (Galatians 4:19)

With groanings which cannot be uttered (Romans 8:26)

210. As a priest, what commandment does God want me to take seriously?

To give glory to His name (Malachi 2:2)

211. As a priest, what happens if I do not take God's commandment seriously?

God will send a curse upon me. (Malachi 2:2–3)

212. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why did God make a covenant of life and peace with Levi (the priests)?

For the fear wherewith he feared me, and was afraid before my name. (Malachi 2:5)

213. What tribe was chosen to serve in the tabernacle?

The tribe of Levi (Numbers 1:47–53; 3:6–9; I Chronicles 15:2)

214. From the tribe of Levi, whom did God choose as priests?

Aaron and his sons (Exodus 28:1; Numbers 16:8–10)

215. Who were the sons of Aaron?

Nadab, Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar (Exodus 28:1)

216. What did Nadab and Abihu offer to God?

Strange fire (Leviticus 10:1–3; Numbers 3:4; 26:61)

217. How did Nadab and Abihu die?

A fire went out from the Lord and devoured them. (Leviticus 10:1–2)

218. How did the children of Israel respond at Taberah?

They complained. (Numbers 11:1)

219. What happened to test the children of Israel's stomach (appetite)?

Their favorite foods were not available, and they felt that they would dry up without them.

(Numbers 11:4-6)

They despised the Lord who was among them.

223. What does it mean to be covetous?

224. How did God test those who coveted?

He sent them an abundance of what they wanted. (Numbers 11:32)

225. What happened at Kadeshbarnea?

Twelve spies went to search the land of Canaan.

Ten spies returned with an evil report, and two returned with a good report.

(Numbers 13-14; Deuteronomy 9:23)

226. What two spies returned with a good report?

Joshua and Caleb (Numbers 14:6–9)

227. How did the children of Israel respond to Joshua and Caleb's report?

They wanted to stone them with stones. (Numbers 14:10)

228. What happened to the ten spies who returned with an evil report?

They all died by the plague before the Lord. (Numbers 14:37)

229. What kind of men were Joshua and Caleb?

They had a different spirit and wholly followed the Lord. (Numbers 14:6, 24, 30; 27:18; 32:12)

230. What did God give Joshua and Caleb?

The land of Canaan that He had promised (Numbers 14:38; 26:65; Joshua 1:1–4; 14:13–14)

231. Whose carcasses fell in the desert?

Everyone 20 years and older who had murmured against the Lord (Numbers 14:29)

232. How many years did the children of Israel wander in the desert because of unbelief?

40 years (Numbers 14:33–35)

233. Why couldn't the children of Israel enter into God's promise?

Because of unbelief (Hebrews 3:19)

234. What is a sign of unbelief?

Disobedience (Nehemiah 9:26; Hebrews 3:8–12, 17–19, NKJV)

235. Who was Korah?

An important Levite (Numbers 16:1, 9)

236. What did Korah do?

Together with 250 other leaders, he rebelled against Moses and Aaron. (Numbers 16:1–50)

237. Against whom did Korah and his company really rebel?

The Lord (Numbers 16:11)

238. What happened to the two hundred fifty leaders who rebelled against the Lord?

There came out a fire from the LORD and consumed them. (Numbers 16:35)

239. How did the children of Israel respond to God's judgment?

They murmured against Moses and against Aaron, saying, Ye have killed the people of the LORD. (Numbers 16:41)

240. How did Moses and Aaron respond when God wanted to destroy the children of Israel?

They fell on their faces before the Lord and interceded for the people. (Numbers 16:20–22, 41–45)

241. Why did God send fiery serpents to the children of Israel?

Because they had spoken against God and against Moses (Numbers 21:5–7)

242. What does the serpent's poison represent?

251. Why wasn't Balaam able to do God's will?



291. How does the message of the ark apply to my life?

296. Why did God place the rainbow in the sky?

298. What does Ur of the Chaldees represent?

The world and my life in the world before coming to know Jesus as my Savior (Genesis 11:31; Ephesians 2:1–3)

299. What does the land of Canaan represent?

It represents my goal as a Christian: the place where Jesus *completely* fills my heart (my earth)—bringing me into true rest. (Exodus 6:3–4; Galatians 2:20; 3:29; Colossians 1:27; Hebrews 3:7–4:12)

300. QUOTATION QUESTION. How does the book of Proverbs describe both the lazy and the diligent man?

The soul of a lazy man desires, and has nothing; But the soul of the diligent shall be made rich. (Proverbs 13:4. NKJV)

301. Why is it important that I be diligent?

Being diligent is not a guarantee that I will hit God's mark for my life, but not being diligent will disqualify me. (Proverbs 6:9–11; 13:4; Hebrews 10:35–37)

302. QUOTATION QUESTION. According to the Bible, who is a child of Abraham's?

And if ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.
(Galatians 3:29)

303. What lesson do I learn from Abram's name?

When I begin my journey with the Lord, I must learn to be humble. (Genesis 11:26; Deuteronomy 8:2)

304. What lesson do I learn from Sarai's name?

When I begin my journey with the Lord, I must learn to obey those in authority over me.

(Genesis 12:10-20; 20:1-18; I Peter 3:6)

305. What two important things do I receive when I meet with God?

The power to be obedient The power to conquer my enemies (Genesis 12; 13:4–8; Luke 19:41–44; John 1:17)

306. What is meekness?

Meekness is surrendering my rights as Jesus surrendered His at Calvary. (Isaiah 53:7)

307. QUOTATION QUESTION. How important is it that I be meek?

Seek ye the Lord, all ye meek of the earth, which have wrought his judgment; seek righteousness, seek meekness: it may be ye shall be hid in the day of the Lord's anger. (Zephaniah 2:3)

311. What happened when Abram and Sarai tried to obtain God's promise their way instead of God's?

Ishmael, a wild man, was born. (Genesis 16:2–15)

312. Why is it important to understand God's visit to Abraham and Lot?

Abraham and Lot represent two different types of Christians. As God visited them, He will also visit me and His visitation will bring either blessing or judgment.

(Genesis 18 and 19; Luke 17:22–37; Romans 4:16; Galatians 3:29)

313. Whom did Lot choose for companions and why?

Lot chose those who were exceedingly wicked and sinful because he did not value the friendship of those who feared God. (Genesis 13:11–14)

He that walketh with wise men shall be wise: but a companion of fools shall be destroyed. (Proverbs 13:20)

315. Whom did Abraham represent when he offered up Isaac?

The heavenly Father who offered up His only begotten Son (Genesis 22:2; John 3:16; Romans 4:16–25; Hebrews 11:17; I John 4:9)

316. QUOTATION QUESTION. When did Abraham receive the promise?

And so, after he had patiently endured, he obtained the promise. (Hebrews 6:15)

317. What were the two aspects of Abraham's faith?

He believed that he would have a son even though it was impossible. He believed that God would raise Isaac from the dead. (Romans 4:19–21; Hebrews 11:17–19)

318. QUOTATION QUESTION. According to the Scripture, what is the earnest expectation of the creature?

For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God. (Romans 8:19)

319. What should I do when I have trials (difficulties)?

Draw water from the well of God's presence by praising, singing, and thanking Him. (Isaiah 12:2–6)

320. When I praise and thank the Lord for my trials (difficulties), what will they do for me?

They will carry me to the place where I will meet with Jesus. (Genesis 24:20–24, 61–64; Isaiah 12:2–6)

321. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why should I love God more than my family?

He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me: and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. (Matthew 10:37)

Jacob longed to inherit the promise that God made to Abraham. Esau didn't care about God or the things of God. (Genesis 25:23, 31–34; Hebrews 12:16)

323. What determines if I am a sheep or a swine to God?

The longings (desires) of my heart (Genesis 25:12–23, 30–34; Matthew 7:6; Hebrews 12:16–17; II Peter 2:22)

324. QUOTATION QUESTION. Can I sin without receiving consequences?

Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.
(Galatians 6:7)

325. What attitude helped Jacob draw (climb) closer to God?

A contrite (crushed, broken) and humble attitude (Genesis 32:9–11)

326. What did it mean when God changed Jacob's name?

That Jacob was a changed man (Genesis 32:27–28)

327. Why does God call Himself the God of Abraham, of Isaac, and of Jacob?

God wants me to have the hope that He can change my life just like He changed theirs. (Exodus 3:15–16)

328. Why did Joseph's brothers hate him?

The coat of many colors proved that their father had chosen Joseph to receive the privileges of both heir and firstborn. (Genesis 37:3–4)

329. In the Bible, what three things did the firstborn inherit?

The natural leadership of the family (I Chronicles 5:1–2) The spiritual leadership of the family (Numbers 3:12) A double portion of the inheritance (Deuteronomy 21:17)

330. QUOTATION QUESTION. Is it right to hate my brother?

Whosoever hateth his brother is a murderer: and ye know that no murderer hath eternal life abiding in him. (I John 3:15)

331. What should I do when I am tempted to do what is wrong?

Flee from temptation (II Timothy 2:22)

332. QUOTATION QUESTION. What is the reward of the diligent?

Seest thou a man diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean men. (Proverbs 22:29)

333. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why did God work all things for good in Joseph's life?

And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose. (Romans 8:28)

334. Why did Joseph name his oldest son Manasseh ("causing to forget")?

Because God had made him forget all his hard work, and all his father's house (Genesis 41:51)

335. Why did Joseph name his youngest son Ephraim ("double fruit")?

Because God had caused him to be fruitful in the land of his affliction (Genesis 41:52)

336. Why did Joseph test his brothers?

Because he wanted to know if God had changed them or if they were still the same hateful and envious men (Genesis 42:9–45:15)

337. Why did Joseph weep when he heard Judah's request?

He saw that the grace and power of God had changed a heart full of hate and envy to a heart full of love and unselfishness. (Genesis 44–45)

338. QUOTATION QUESTION. How can I fulfill all of God's commandments?

For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.
(Galatians 5:14, NKJV)

339. What had the grace and power of God done in Joseph's life?

It had helped him to forgive his brothers and to forget all his hard labor. (Genesis 41:51–52; 45:1–15; 50:17–21)

340. QUOTATION QUESTION. Who did Joseph say had sent him to Egypt and why?

God sent me before you to preserve a posterity for you in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance. So now it was not you who sent me here, but God.
(Genesis 45:7–8a, NKJV)

341. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why did Moses kill the Egyptian?

He supposed his brethren would have understood how that God by his hand would deliver them: but they understood not. (Acts 7:25)

342. QUOTATION QUESTION. What lesson do I learn from Moses' killing of the Egyptian without God's leading?

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. (Isaiah 55:9)

343. QUOTATION QUESTION. What did Moses choose?

Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season. (Hebrews 11:25)

Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompense of the reward. (Hebrews 11:26)

By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible. (Hebrews 11:27)

346. Why did Moses name his oldest son Gershom ("refugee")?

For he said, I have been a stranger in a strange land. (Exodus 2:22)

347. Why did Moses name his youngest son Eliezer ("God of help")?

The God of my father, said he, was mine help, and delivered me from the sword of Pharaoh. (Exodus 18:4)

348. QUOTATION QUESTION. How does God feel towards those who consider themselves strangers and pilgrims on the earth?

God is not ashamed to be called their God: for he hath prepared for them a city. (Hebrews 11:16b)

349. How does the book of Acts describe Moses?

Moses was learned in all the wisdom of the Egyptians, and was mighty in words and in deeds. (Acts 7:22)

350. What does it mean to be humble?

To allow God to crush me and bring me down to a low place (Isaiah 57:15)

351. How did Moses' desert experience change his life?

He no longer felt capable of delivering the children of Israel. He considered himself to be slow of speech and slow of tongue. He became a meek and humble man. (Exodus 3:11; 4:10, 13; Numbers 12:3)

352. How does God make me feel uncomfortable in the world?

With slavery and hard bondage to Satan (sin) (Exodus 1:11, 14; I Corinthians 10:1–11)

353. When is God moved to send a Savior?

When His children recognize their need for His help and cry out to Him (Exodus 3:7–9)

The deceitfulness of sin (Hebrews 3:13)

355. What softens my heart?

Meetings with Jesus (Job 23:16; Psalm 65:10)

To judge those who hardened their hearts against His Word To set His people free from slavery (Exodus 3:19–20; 7:14–12:36)

357. What would have happened to the children of Israel if Moses had agreed to compromise with Pharaoh?

The children of Israel would have served God halfheartedly and Pharaoh would have continued to control their lives. (Exodus 8–10)

358. What does God say about those who serve Him halfheartedly?

He will vomit them out of His mouth. (Revelation 3:15–16, NKJV)

359. How does Jesus teach me to celebrate my salvation experience (the Feast of Passover)?

By partaking of communion (the Lord's Supper) and remembering what the Lamb of God has done for me (Luke 22:7–20; I Corinthians 11:23–26)

360. What two things must I experience before I partake of communion (the Lord's Supper)?

Salvation Water baptism (Exodus 12:43–48; Colossians 2:11–12)

361. How should I partake of communion (the Lord's Supper)?

Examining my heart with a repentant attitude Discerning the Lord's body (I Corinthians 11:28–31)

362. QUOTATION QUESTION. What happens if I partake of communion (the Lord's Supper) in an unworthy manner?

For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep [are dead].
(I Corinthians 11:30)

363. What three things must I experience before being baptized in water?

Believe on Jesus Experience true repentance Desire to live differently (Acts 8:36–37; 2:38; Romans 6:4)

364. What is essential for survival in my desert experiences?

To have meetings with the One who is the Word of God (Isaiah 43:19–20; John 1:1–4; 7:38; 15:3; Hebrews 1:3)

365. What does the apostle Paul say about the children of Israel's journey?

The details of their journey are a warning for me. (I Corinthians 10:1–11)

366. What is the main purpose of my journey with the Lord?

To bring me into God's inheritance (Canaan) where He inherits me and I inherit Him

(Exodus 6:6–8; Ezekiel 36:27–28; Colossians 1:27; Ephesians 2:1–6)

367. When God gives me a promise, why does He wait to fulfill it?

He waits for me to grow in humility so that when He fulfills it, pride will not destroy me.

(Deuteronomy 8:16)

368. QUOTATION QUESTION. What instruction does the book of Hebrews give me for my journey?

Be not slothful, but followers of them who through faith and patience inherit the promises.

(Hebrews 6:12)

369. What does the desert represent in my life?

Uncomfortable and impossible situations
Doubts and fears
(Deuteronomy 8:15; Jeremiah 2:6; I Corinthians 10:1–11)

370. What does the journey of the children of Israel show me?

Where I once was Where I find myself Where I'm going (Exodus, Numbers, I Corinthians 10:1–11)

371. In my journey with the Lord, what does He want me to remember?

He will never leave me or forsake me.

He will not allow me to be tempted beyond what I am able to bear. (Deuteronomy 31:6, 8; I Corinthians 10:13; Hebrews 13:5–6)

372. How did God go before the children of Israel and what do I learn?

He went in a pillar of cloud by day and in a pillar of fire by night. God is with me, *always* caring for me. (Exodus 13:21–22; Matthew 28:20)

I will believe that it is better to die under slavery and hard bondage to Satan. When trials come, I will want to return to the world. (Exodus 14:10–12)

376. What will happen if my eyes are on Jesus?

I will believe that it is better to die in the desert seeking God's promise than to die under slavery and hard bondage to Satan. (Job 13:15; Hebrews 12:2–4)

377. In impossible situations, what opportunity do I have?

To know the Lord as a man of war, my strength, and my salvation (Exodus 15:2–18)

378. What two things will determine if I finish my journey with the Lord?

My actions and attitudes (Exodus; I Peter 5:5; James 2:20, 26)

379. What happened at Marah?

The children of Israel went three days without finding water.

When they found water, it was bitter.

God showed Moses a tree that Moses cast into the bitter water to make it sweet.

(Exodus 15:22-26)

380. In bitter experiences, what opportunities do I have?

To know the Lord as my Healer
To know the Lord as the One who makes every bitter thing sweet.
(Exodus 15:25–26)

381. QUOTATION QUESTION. Does God care what my attitude towards my parents is?

The eye that mocketh at his father, and despiseth to obey his mother, the ravens of the valley shall pick it out, and the young eagles shall eat it. (Proverbs 30:17)

382. QUOTATION QUESTION. What does the Bible teach me about discipline?

He who withholds his rod hates his son, but he who loves him disciplines him diligently.

(Proverbs 13:24, NASB)

383. How can I please God in trials of obedience?

By not resisting but staying in the trial until the rebellion in me has been broken

(Exodus 16:4, 20; Hebrews 5:8)

384. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why does God command me to obey my leaders?

For they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you. (Hebrews 13:17b)

385. Why did God feed the children of Israel with manna?

That He might make them know that man does not live by bread alone; but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the LORD (Deuteronomy 8:3)

386. In trials of obedience, what opportunity do I have?

To know the Lord as the Bread of Life (Deuteronomy 8:3; John 6:31–35, 48–51, 58)

387. How can I please God in times of spiritual dryness and thirst?

By seeking Him more, praising Him, and searching for a deeper relationship with Him (Psalm 63:1–8; Isaiah 44:1–3)

388. QUOTATION QUESTION. When we feel faint and weary, what does the Bible tell us to do?

But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint. (Isaiah 40:31)

389. QUOTATION QUESTION. What is required to please God?

But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

392. How can I please God in times of desolation and lack of progress?

Have a heart of true repentance (for past failures) Have a cry that recognizes who I am Have a desire to run after the Lord in spite of who I am (Exodus 34:5–10)

393. QUOTATION QUESTION. In times of desolation and lack of progress, what opportunity do I have?

To know the LORD God who is: ...merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth, Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, and that will by no means clear the guilty. (Exodus 34:6b–7a)

394. What three things do I need for a successful journey with the Lord?

A personal relationship with Jesus (Exodus 12; John 3:3) A spiritual leader to obey and follow (Acts 7:35–39; Hebrews 13:17) The baptism in the Holy Spirit (Exodus 19; Acts 2:1–4, 33, 38)

395. Why is the baptism in the Holy Spirit so important?

399. QUOTATION QUESTION. Which is the first commandment with promise?

Honor thy father and thy mother; That it may be well with thee, and thou mayest live long on the earth. (Ephesians 6:2–3)

400. QUOTATION QUESTION. Which of the commandments warns me to **be** careful with how I use God's name?

Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain. (Exodus 20:7)

401. QUOTATION QUESTION. Which of the commandments warns me to tell the truth?

Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor. (Exodus 20:16)

406. What were the three main parts of the tabernacle?

Outer Court Holy Place Holy of Holies (Exodus 27:9–18; 26:1–37; Ezekiel 10:5; Hebrews 9:2–7, 25)

407. What is now open to all true Christians through Jesus?

The way into the Holy of Holies (Hebrews 9:7–14; 10:19–20)

408. How can I enter through the door?

I must recognize my need for a Savior.

I must believe in Jesus: calling out to Him to save me and cleanse me from my sins.

I must be baptized in water.

(Acts 2:21; 16:31; 20:21; Romans 10:9–10; I John 1:9; Mark 16:16)

409. What is proof that I have gone through the door (had a salvation experience)?

I have had a meeting with Jesus that has changed my life.

I know that my sins have been forgiven.

I know that the Bible is inspired by God.

I have been baptized.

(Exodus 27:16; John 3:16, 36; 10:7:9; II Corinthians 5:17; Hebrews 9:22; Mark 16:16)

410. QUOTATION QUESTION. How important is Jesus' name?

Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved. (Acts 4:12)

411. QUOTATION QUESTION. Who will God save?

He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.
(Mark 16:16)

412. QUOTATION QUESTION. What does First John say about sin?

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
(I John 1:9)

413. What lesson do I learn at the laver?

God takes very seriously how I come before Him. I must be clean before I come before Him to worship. (Exodus 30:19–21; Psalm 26:6)

414. How can I dishonor God's name?

By not offering my best to God By believing that it's so much trouble and so tiring to bring an offering to God (Leviticus 3:6: 4:32: 9:3: 14:10: 22:21–22. 24–25: 23:12: Malachi 1:6–14)

415. Describe the fire on the brazen altar.

It was sent from God. It was to be kept burning continually. (Leviticus 9:24; 6:13)

416. What lesson do I learn at the brazen altar?

Through sacrifices and offerings, God has provided a way for me to keep the fire of His presence burning continually in my heart. (Leviticus 6:13; Luke 14:26–27; Romans 8:13)

417. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why does God want my light to shine?

Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven. (Matthew 5:16)

418. What does it mean to intercede?

To put myself in the place and situation of someone else and make a request for them

(Remana 8:26, 27, 24) Colotions 4:40) Limethy 2:41 Hebrews 7:25)

(Romans 8:26–27, 34; Galatians 4:19; I Timothy 2:1; Hebrews 7:25)

419. QUOTATION QUESTION. Who should I fear and who should I dread?

Sanctify the LORD of hosts himself; and let him be your fear, and let him be your dread. (Isaiah 8:13)

420. What lesson does God want me to learn from Nadab and Abihu?

I cannot draw near to God my way and expect to live. I must draw near His way. (Leviticus 10:1–4; Numbers 3:4)

421. QUOTATION QUESTION. What does God promise to do with the sons of Levi?

He shall sit as a refiner and purifier of silver: and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto the LORD an offering in righteousness. (Malachi 3:3)

422. How did the cloud lead the way for the children of Israel?

When the cloud moved off the tabernacle, the children of Israel journeyed. When the cloud rested on the tabernacle, the children of Israel rested. (Numbers 9:17–22)

423. What happened while the children of Israel journeyed towards Taberah?

The ark of the covenant of the Lord went before them to search out a resting place and the cloud of the Lord was upon them by day. (Numbers 10:33–36)

424. How did God respond to the children of Israel's complaining at Taberah?

He heard and was angry.

His fire burnt among them and consumed some in the outskirts of the camp.

(Numbers 11:1–3)

425. How did the children of Israel make their requests known to God?

Without waiting for His counsel (they thought they knew better than God) With complaints against their leader and against God (Numbers 11:4–6, 10; Psalm 78:18–20; 106:13)

426. QUOTATION QUESTION. How can I please God when I am tempted to be unthankful?

Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord; Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.. (Ephesians 5:19–20)

427. QUOTATION QUESTION. Who are enemies of the cross of Christ?

Those ... whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame—who set their mind on earthly things (Philippians 3:19, NKJV)

428. How can I please God with my stomach?

I can fast to overcome the enemy of the cross who lives inside of me. (Philippians 3:18–19; II Corinthians 11:27)

429. What does God want me to do when I have a need?

He wants me to wait for His counsel so that my request can be made according to His will.

(Psalm 106:13; I John 5:14-15)

430. QUOTATION QUESTION. How did Jesus make His requests known?

Who in the days of his flesh, when he had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto him that was able to save him from death, and was heard in that he feared (Hebrews 5:7)

431. What is sin?

Anything that violates God's will (Romans 3:23)

432. QUOTATION QUESTION. How can I please God when I am tempted to be covetous?

Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. (Hebrews 13:5)

433. How can I please God when He sends abundance?

If I am faithful when I only have a little and I allow God to root covetousness out of my heart, I will not act foolishly when He sends me abundance.

(Numbers 11:31-34; Luke 16:10)

434. QUOTATION QUESTION. How did Joshua and Caleb respond at Kadeshbarnea?

Rebel not ye against the LORD, neither fear ye the people of the land; for they are bread for us: their defense is departed from them, and the LORD is with us: fear them not. (Numbers 14:9)

435. How did the children of Israel respond at Kadeshbarnea?

They wept.

They desired to have died in Egypt or in the desert. They desired to make a new leader and return to Egypt. (Numbers 14:1–4)

436. What happened to Joshua and Caleb in the desert?

They believed God and allowed His grace and power to change their lives. (Numbers 14:24; 27:18; 32:11–12)

437. Why couldn't the children of Israel believe God?

They had rejected God's voice, and God's voice (which always brings His presence) gives the faith to believe.

(Exodus 20:18-21; Hebrews 12:18-20; 4:2; Romans 10:17)

438. QUOTATION QUESTION. According to Hebrews, why should I beware?

Lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief in departing from the living God

(Hebrews 3:12, NKJV)

439. Why did the children of Israel fail every trial?

They didn't love the Lord in their trials.

They weren't humble (always thought they knew better than God). By rejecting God's voice and presence, they didn't have the faith to believe.

(Exodus 20:19–21; Psalm 106:13; Hebrews 3:19; 12:20; Romans 10:17)

440. QUOTATION QUESTION. What did Moses command the children of Israel about Korah, Dathan, and Abiram?

Depart now from the tents of these wicked men! Touch nothing of theirs, lest you be consumed in all their sins. (Numbers 16:26, NKJV)

441. QUOTATION QUESTION. What does the Bible say about the sin of rebellion?

For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry.

(I Samuel 15:23)

442. Why was God angry with Balaam?

Even after Balaam knew that it was *not* God's will for him to go with King Balak, he insisted that God let him go. (Numbers 22:12–22)

443. What will happen if I resist God's will and insist on doing things my way?

God will give me what I want, but I will lose His blessing. (Numbers 22:12–22, 31–33; 31:8; Psalm 106:15; II Peter 2:15; Jude 1:11)

444. QUOTATION QUESTION. What is the root of all evil?

For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.

(I Timothy 6:10)

445. QUOTATION QUESTION. Why is it important that my name be found written in the book of life?

And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire.

(Revelation 20:15)

446. QUOTATION QUESTION. According to Romans, who will die and who will live?

For if you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. (Romans 8:13, NKJV)

447. QUOTATION QUESTION. According to Hebrews, how are we to serve God and why?

Let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and Godly fear: for our God is a consuming fire. (Hebrews 12:28–29)

448. What lesson do I learn from the death of the old generation in the desert?







414. How can I dishonor God's name?

By not offering my best to God

By believing that it's so much trouble and so tiring to bring an offering to God (Leviticus 3:6; 4:32; 9:3; 14:10; 22:21–22, 24–25; 23:12; Malachi 1:6–14)

408. How can I enter through the door?

I must recognize my need for a Savior.

I must believe in Jesus: calling out to Him to save me and cleanse me from my sins.

I must be baptized in water.

(Acts 2:21; 16:31; 20:21; Romans 10:9–10; I John 1:9; Mark 16:16)

392. How can I please God in times of desolation and lack of progress?

Have a heart of true repentance (for past failures)

Have a cry that recognizes who I am

Have a desire to run after the Lord in spite of who I am

(Exodus 34:5-10)

387. How can I please God in times of spiritual dryness and thirst?

By seeking Him more, praising Him, and searching for a deeper relationship with Him

(Psalm 63:1-8; Isaiah 44:1-3)

383. How can I please God in trials of obedience?

By not resisting but staying in the trial until the rebellion in me has been broken (Exodus 16:4, 20; Hebrews 5:8)

433. How can I please God when He sends abundance?

If I am faithful when I only have a little and I allow God to root covetousness out of my heart, I will not act foolishly when He sends me abundance.

(Numbers 11:31-34; Luke 16:10)

428. How can I please God with my stomach?

I can fast to overcome the enemy of the cross who lives inside of me. (Philippians 3:18–19; II Corinthians 11:27)

372. How did God go before the children of Israel and what do I learn?

He went in a pillar of cloud by day and in a pillar of fire by night. God is with me, *always* caring for me. (Exodus 13:21–22; Matthew 28:20)

424. How did God respond to the children of Israel's complaining at Taberah?

He heard and was angry.

His fire burnt among them and consumed some in the outskirts of the camp. (Numbers 11:1–3)

351. How did Moses' desert experience change his life?

He no longer felt capable of delivering the children of Israel. He considered himself to be slow of speech and slow of tongue.

He became a meek and humble man.

(Exodus 3:11: 4:10. 13: Numbers 12:3)

294. How did the animals come to the ark and what do I learn from that?

God brought the animals to the ark supernaturally. God brings (draws) me to Himself supernaturally. (Genesis 7:1–9)

425. How did the children of Israel make their requests known to God?

Without waiting for His counsel (they thought they knew better than God) With complaints against their leader and against God (Numbers 11:4–6, 10; Psalm 78:18–20; 106:13)

435. How did the children of Israel respond at Kadeshbarnea?

They wept.

They desired to have died in Egypt or in the desert.

They desired to make a new leader and return to Egypt.

(Numbers 14:1-4)

422. How did the cloud lead the way for the children of Israel?

When the cloud moved off the tabernacle, the children of Israel journeyed. When the cloud rested on the tabernacle, the children of Israel rested. (Numbers 9:17-22)

260. How do we know that Christ, the Son of God, is the Creator?

According to the Gospel of John, the Son of God is the Word made flesh and that Word created all things. (John 1:1–14)

267. How does Abel's life remind me of God's plan (as revealed in the first day of creation)?

Abel offered a lamb to God which reminds me of Jesus, the Lamb of God, who was offered on the cross to give me salvation. (Genesis 4:4; John 1:29; Hebrews 5:9; 11:4)

275. How does Enoch's life remind me of God's plan (as revealed in the second day of creation)?

Enoch became God's messenger because he allowed God to replace all his worldly thoughts with God's heavenly thoughts. (Jeremiah 15:19; Jude 1:14-16)

352. How does God make me feel uncomfortable in the world?

With slavery and hard bondage to Satan (sin) (Exodus 1:11, 14: I Corinthians 10:1-11)

359. How does Jesus teach me to celebrate my salvation experience (the Feast of Passover)?

By partaking of communion (the Lord's Supper) and remembering what the Lamb of God has done for me (Luke 22:7–20; I Corinthians 11:23–26)

293. How does pitch, used to cover the ark within and without, apply to my life?

If I am part of God's church (the ark) and Christ's atonement (pitch) is covering my life within and without. I will be kept from sinking in the stormy trials (difficulties) of life. (Genesis 6:14; Romans 5:8-11)

349. How does the book of Acts describe Moses?

Moses was learned in all the wisdom of the Egyptians, and was mighty in words and in deeds. (Acts 7:22)

266. How does the door of the tabernacle remind me of God's plan (as revealed in the first day of creation)?

Jesus says, I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved. (John 10:9a)

290. How is the ark a figure of the church?

The ark held the animals that were saved from God's judgment on the wicked

The church holds the Lord's sheep who will be saved from His judgments on the wicked in the last days.

(Genesis 7 and 8; Matthew 24:37-39; John 10:27-28)

361. How should I partake of communion (the Lord's Supper)?

Examining my heart with a repentant attitude Discerning the Lord's body (I Corinthians 11:28–31)

282. How was man created in the image of God?

God made man with a body that resembles His own: with a head, hands, and feet

(Genesis 1:26: Song of Solomon 5:11-16: 1 Peter 2:24)

283. How was man created in the likeness of God?

God made man with an emotional and spiritual life like His own. (Genesis 1:26)

259. How was the Bible given to man?

Through the power of the Holy Ghost, holy men of God were inspired to speak and write the message that God wanted to give to His people and to all mankind.

(II Peter 1:21)

322. How were Jacob and Esau different?

Jacob longed to inherit the promise that God made to Abraham. Esau didn't care about God or the things of God. (Genesis 25:23, 31–34; Hebrews 12:16)

To know the Lord as my Healer
To know the Lord as the One who makes every bitter thing sweet.
(Exodus 15:25–26)

391. In Ephesians chapter six, what is the only weapon of attack found in God's armor?

The sword of the spirit, which is the Word of God (Ephesians 6:17)

377. In impossible situations, what opportunity do I have?

To know the Lord as a man of war, my strength, and my salvation (Exodus 15:2–18)

371. In my journey with the Lord, what does He want me to remember?

He will never leave me or forsake me.

He will not allow me to be tempted beyond what I am able to bear. (Deuteronomy 31:6, 8; I Corinthians 10:13; Hebrews 13:5–6)

329. In the Bible, what three things did the firstborn inherit?

The natural leadership of the family (I Chronicles 5:1–2) The spiritual leadership of the family (Numbers 3:12) A double portion of the inheritance (Deuteronomy 21:17)
